

DEEDS AND WILLS

The following are in chronological order by years. They come mainly from the hand-written records of deeds (known as 'memorials') held in the Registry of Deeds in Henrietta Street, Dublin and Sir William Betham's Abstracts of Wills held in the Dublin Genealogical Office. Where possible, links are provided to original documents available online.

1702 Will Betham's Abstracts I/61 p. 102 no. 243: Jonathan Short Gurteen Sp: Bridget ? Children: Jonathon, Elizabeth Shortt Jeffrey Brother = **James and his sons Jonathon and William**; Brother = Michael and his son John; Son-in-law = David Jeffrey; Uncle = Michael Short and his dau Elizabeth; Brothers = Robert Pike and Luke Davys; Sarah the eldest daughter of Robert Pike.

1710 Deed 39 52 23932 Part A and Part B: Assignment dated 4th day of April 1710 from Honorable Wm. Worth of Dublin and son Edward Worth to **James Short of Castleroan** in the King's Co. gent ... part of townsland of Kilmacstullagh ... 347 acres in Owny and Arra, Parish of Templescally and Killmacstullagh ... fishing weyers (weirs?) in Shannon ... castle, houses, edifices and buildings ... for and during the natural lives of **John Short eldest son** and **William Short second son** of the said James Short and **Jonathan Short third son** ... Lands from James Short to John Short ...

1710 Deed 6 271 2122 Part A and Part B: 2nd/3rd/11/1710 **James Short of Kilmcstolley** to Jane May spinster re Gurtnapissy in Curaheen, Upper Ormond. Witnesses include **Jonathan Short son of James**.

1710 Deed 35 437 231249: 2nd/5/1710 **James Short of Kilmacstolley** to Robert Pyke of Park and Henry Fletcher of Dunkerrin re lands of Park, Killea Park, Grange, Gortbrack, Caherseraghbegg, the Curragh called Finane in Eliogarty & Ikerrin, Co. Tipperary.

1711 Deed 7 346 2644: 14th/15th/1/1711 **James Short of Killmastolly** and Jane May to Robert Pyke re Gurtnapissy in Curaheen, Upper Ormond. Witnesses **Jonathan Short Gent** and **James Short Yeoman**.

1713 Deed 66 242 46035 Part A and Part B: 13/03/1713 refers to lease dated 25/05/1797 (*surely this should read 1697?!*) to **Michael Short** by Ralph Wilson and David Wilson of houses and garden in Parish of St John Baptist in City of Limerick. to Michael Short, for and during natural lives of **Elizabeth Short**, one of said Michael's daughters, **Jonathan Short Jnr son of Jonathan Short of Gourtegerly** in Co. of Limerick gent. Michael Short leases the property to Elizabeth Griffiths

1716 Deed 38 30 23151 Part A and Part B: 25th/26th/9/1716 **James Short of Kilmuckstollen** and **John Short** son and heir to the said James Short then of Castlerone to Daniel Rogers lands of Garrybreedy, Knockadigeen, Ballyvanrahan and Ballygibbon (also Ballysinode) in Upper Ormond.

1717 Deed 69 139 47627: 21/10/1717 between Thomas Franck of Franckfort, King's Co and **John, William and Jonathan**, three of the sons of **James Short of Killmastulla**, Tipperary – townsland of Castleroan, 317 acres Irish plantation measure lately held by James Short and others aforesaid and John and Jonathan make over two thirds to William Short.

1725 Deed 65 344 45836 Part A and Part B: 12th/13th/04/1725 **Ann Short** also Carmody widow of John Carmody of Garrynoe and **James Short of Garrynoe** Gent, son and heir of **Michael Short** late of city of Limerick, sadler, on the one part and Elizabeth Griffiths, widow, on the other part refers to 1697 deed re house and garden in Limerick during lives of **Elizabeth Short**, one of said Michael's daughters and **Jonathan Short Jnr son of Jonathan Short of Gortigarry** in Co. Tipp.

1728 Deed 58 451 40134 Part A and Part B: 19/7/1728 between John Short and Thomas Short of Grange, Queens Co and **James Short of Ballyvanron**, Upper Ormond, Tipperary, Gent – lands of Garrybredy, Comonstown, Knockdiggin, Ballygibonates, Ballyvenod and Ballyvanron all in Upper Ormond that had been mortgaged to John Short, Esq. decd – Ballyvanron to James Shortt and heirs for ever, Garrybredy and Comonstown, Knockdiggin, Ballygibon and Ballysenod to James Short and heirs for 100 years. Witnesses included **Jonathan Shortt of Killmastullagh**. (*Is this the first instance of the 'Shortt' spelling of the name?!*)

1728 Deed 69 139 47628 Part A and Part B: 26th/27th/07/1728 between John Short of Grange and **James Short of Ballyvanron**, Upper Ormond on one part and **William Short** of Castle Rowan on the other – Ballyvanron to William Short and his heirs for ever, nevertheless to be held by **James Short and Susanna his wife** while they live – signed in the presence of **James Short, Roscrea**, Innkeeper, witnesses **Jonathan and John Short of Killmastulla**, aforesaid Gent (*BUT no John of Killmastulla mentioned before!!!*). Signatures include Jononth (sic) Shortt Jnr(?).

1728 Deed 57 397 39040 Part A and Part B: 24/9/1728 **John Short of Grange**, Queen's Co to **John Pyke of Killea** Co Tipperary lands of Park, Killea, Grange and Gortbrack in Ikerrin, also Lakesherraghbegg and Carragh Finane in Ikerrin, also Garybreedy als Knuckdigeen, Ballygibbon als Ballysinode in Upper Ormond.

1729 Deed 116 207 80246 Part A and Part B: Deed dated 27/11/1729 but registered 8/12/1744, **John Short of Grange** to **John Pyke** lands of Park, Killea, Grange, Gortbrack, Lakeserraghbegg and Curragh Finane Co Tipp. John Pyke to John Short lands of Garrybreedy Knockdigeen Ballygibbon ors Ballysinode but rent (Edward Minchin) because not able to put John Pyke in actual possession of Knockdigeen and Garrybreedy. Witnesses include **Ann Pyke widow**, executor of the will of John Pyke 14/09/1744.

1730 Deed 64 473 44672 Part A and Part B: 30/8/1730 **Jonathan Short of Cappanakedy**, son of **James Short**, and **John Short of Kilmastulla**, brother of Jonathan Short, to Darby McKeogh lands of Cappanakedy, part of Kilmastulla (ref to 1710 Wm Worth deed).

1732 Deed 72 16 49489 Part A, Part B and Part C: 06/05/1732 **John Short of Kilmastulla** and **Elizabeth Short** (ors Edwards) his wife to Derby McKeogh late of Cappanakedy mansion, houses, outhouses, stables, orchards and lands of Killmastulla for 31 years (but Edward Worth can fish fowl and hunt there). Ref to mills and river. Ref also to **Mrs Susanna Short widow of James Short** and to marle and turf in Cappanakedy. Witnesses inc **Jonathan Short**.

1736 Deed 87 44 60506: 22/1/1736 Benjamin Frend to **William Short of Castlerooan** Kings Co re lands of Ballynamore, Longford for lives of **John Short** (1st son) **James Short** (2nd son) and **Ellinor Short** (eldest daughter).

1737 Deed 87 235 61428: 21/6/1737 **John Short of Castle Roan** to Derby McKeogh of Kilmastulla re Moneen, Marrahill and Gurteenevie, being parts of Kilmastulla.

1737 Deed 94 420 67126: 29/4/1737 Benjamin Frend to James Mason re Gortnahumah(?) and Loughnakillah(?) during lives of **John Shortt, eldest son of William Short of Castlerooan**, and of John Mason and Phebe Mason of Rathdowney.

1737 Deed 88 149 62014 Part A and Part B: 7/10/1737 **John Short of Kilmastulla** to Arthur Carmody re Cappanakedy (ref to Wm Worth deed 1710 to James Short late of Castlerooan deceased).

1742 Deed 106 573 76279 Part A and Part B: 23th/24th/03/1742 **William Short of Castlerooan**, eldest son and heir of James Short, decd. late of Castlerooan to Mary Jesse and Margaret Jesse,

daughters of late David Jesse and William Jesse, brother of Mary and Margaret, lands of Farrenrore Co Tipp, also Gortbally.

1750 Deed 149 83 98944: 20/10/1750 **John Short** and **James Short** both of Kilmastulla, Tipp on one part and **Jonathan Short** son unto above John on the other – lands in Kilmastulla (Gortenavea and Mooneine) - in presence of **Jonathan Short Snr of Cappekedey**, Tipp and of **James Short** son of **William Short, Castlerooan** and of Robert Pyke of Park, Tipp and of **John Short of Gurteen**, Tipp. Ref to 3/11/1710 deed Wm Worth to **James Short late of Castlerooan** deceased. Witnesses Jonathan Short Snr of Cappenkedy, James Short son of William Short of Castlerooan, Robert Pyke of Park. Mention also of **John Short of Gurteen**.

1750 Deed 144 336 97740 Part A and Part B: 19/12/1750 **John Short, James Short** son and heir of said John and **Jonathan Short the younger** also son of said John all of Boher part of Killmastulla on the one part and **William Short of Castlerooan** on the other re Hon Wm Worth 1710 Deed (see above). Said James Short by deed 19th February 1720 (excluding Cappenkedy) to his said son John Short and Cappenkedy to said son Jonathan., said John, James and Jonathan to William all except Cappenkedy. Witnesses inc Robt Pike of Park and **James Short of Castlerooan** son of William Short.

1752 Deed 223 239 148057 Part A and Part B: 10/02/1752 **John Short of Killmastulla** and **James Short**, eldest son and heir of said John on first part, Thos Smythies elder and Jane Smythies his daughter of Curraghbehy on second and **John Short of Pallis** (*looks more like Pattis but is surely Pallis?*) in said county and Thos Smythies younger on third - re marriage between James and **Jane Smythies** - John and James transfer to John of Pallis part of Kilmastulla. Ref to Grice Mill and Tuck Mill.

1757 Deed 184 453 123779: 28/02/1757 **Jonathan Shortt** second son of **John Shortt of Killmastulla** on one part to **William Short of Castlerooane** (*but further down has two t's in surname*) on the other - part of lands of Kilmastulla (Gorteenevea and Mooneine). Ref to 1710 Deed Wm Worth to James Short, grandfather of said Jonathan) - 81 acres.

1762 Deed 218 467 144376 Part A and Part B: 16th/08/1762 **John Short of Wingfield**, Co. Tipp and **Jonathan Short** son and heir apparent of said John on one part to Thomas Spinner of Milltown, Kings Co - lands of Gurtagarry otherways Curraheen and Dromeene otherways Dromeen.

1767 Will Betham's Abstracts I/64 p.21 no. 46 John Shortt of Wingfield, Co. Tipp.
Gent. 18/5/1767 - 22/12/1768 Wife Frances. Sons Jonathan (1), Thomas (2), John (3). Dau. Frances. Youngest son Charles. Grandsons - Oliver and John Grace sons of son-in-law Robert Grace. Dau(?) Mary Sheppard(?) Shortt. Mrs. Eliz Grace mother of said son-in-law. Dau. Sarah Grace wife of said son-in-law.

1768 Deed 307 93 203131: 06/06/1768 **Jonathan Short**, merchant of Nenagh, to Malachy Glisson and Mark Glisson of Gurteenyvie in Co. Tipp. re part of Kilmastulla known as Gurteenyvie and also Keaglass.

1770 Deed 277 536 179684 Part A and Part B: 16/02/1770 Frank Bernard of Carlow and **Frances Short**, widow and sole executrix of John Short deceased. Lloyd and Smith reciting that **Jonathan Short and John Short** mortgaged lands of Gurteen, Tenekelly, Longford. Also Gurtegarry, Carragheen and Drumeene to Thos Bernard.

1770 Deed 280 481 182325 Part A and Part B: 26/5/1770 Timothy Bagnel the Younger of Rahue Westmeath eldest son of Timothy Bagnel the Elder and **John Shortt of Pallas** and **Mary Shortt** eldest dau of said John - marriage shortly between Mary and Timothy the younger. Witnesses inc Revd James North of Summerville Co Tipp.

1770 Deeds relating to Gurteen 271 272 179702 [Part A](#) and [Part B](#), 271 273 179703 [Part A](#), [Part B](#) and [Part C](#), 271 275 179704 [Part A](#) and [Part B](#), 271 275 179705 [Part A](#) and [Part B](#), also transcriptions of [179703](#), [179704](#) and [179705](#). Abstracts of all four deeds follow immediately below.

1770 Deed 271 272 179702 [Part A](#) and [Part B](#): 7th/8th/2/1770 Wm Lloyd of Dublin to Right honble John Lord Baron of Baltinglass the lands of Gurteen, Longford and Tenekelly.

1770 Deed 271 273 179703 [Part A](#), [Part B](#) and [Part C](#): 8/2/1770 between John Smith of the City of Dublin Gent (1st) the Honble & Rev^d Paul Stratford third Son of the Right honble John Lord Baron of Baltinglass (2nd) and W^m Lloyd of the City of Dublin Esq^r Doctor of Physick (3rd) ... refers to 18/4/1698 lease by Joseph Lloyd to **Jonathan Short** then of Gurteen Gent lands of Gurteen, Tenekelly and Longford ... **John Short** late of Wingfield Decd in & before January 1766 became entitled to ... and by deed 18/1/1766 made between him the adm^r of the property of Jonathan Short of Gurteen decd with his will annexed unadministered by **Rebecca Short** Widow and **Jonathan Short** Son and heir apparent of the said John Short of the one part & Thomas Bernard of the other part ... lands of Gurteen Tenekelly and Longford. Witnesses include Henry Palmer.

1770 Deed 271 275 179704 [Part A](#) and [Part B](#): 17/2/1770 between Franks Bernard (1st) **Frances Short** of Wingfield Widow and Sole exor named in the Last will and Testament of **John Short** late of Wingfield (2nd) Wm Lloyd of Dublin Doctor of Physick (3rd) and John Smyth of Dublin Gent (4th)... recites that by 8/1/1766 deed between **John Short** of Wingfield am^r of property of **Jonathan Short** of Gurteen Gent decd with his will annexed unadministered by **Rebecca Short** widow and **Jonathan Short** Son and heir apparent of the said John Short of the one part and Thomas Bernard of the other part reciting that by 18/4/1798 lease by Joseph Lloyd to Jonathan Short then of Gurteen father of the s^d John Short the Lands of Gurteen Tenekelly and Longford and that said Lease and Leasehold Premes became Legally vested in said John & Jonathan Short parties thereto and that said John & Jonathan Short or one of them was or were also entitled to Fee Farm rent out of the Lands of Gurtegarry otherwise Gurtegarry Curragheen otherwise Currakeen & Drumeen otherwise Dromeen in s^d County of Tippey by virtue of a 16/8/1762 lease made by said John & Jonathan Short to Thomas Spinner.

1770 Deed 271 275 179705 [Part A](#) and [Part B](#): 3/2/1770 (registered 17/2/1770) between **Frances Short** of Wingfield Widow of **John Short** Gent decd Eldest Son and heir at Law of **Jonathan Short the younger** late of Gurteen Gent decd with his will annexed unadministered by **Rebecca Short** Widow and one of the Exors of the said Jonathan Short the younger which said Frances Short is also adm^r of the property of Jonathan Short the Elder late of Gurteen Gent decd with his Will annexed unadministered by James Short one of the Exors of said Jonathan Short the elder and also by the said Jonathan Short the younger who was adm^r of the property of the s^d Jonathan Short the Elder (1st part) John Smyth of Dublin Gent (2nd) and Wm Lloyd Doctor of Physics (3rd). Reference to 18/4/1698 lease by Joseph Lloyd to Jonathan Short the Elder of Gurteen of 59 acres and 16 Perches of Profitable Lands and 48 Acres of unprofitable Lands in Gurteen, 31 Acres and 8 Perches more of Profitable Lands in Gurteen, 20 Acres of unprofitable Lands in the Same, 89 Acres of profitable Lands in Tenekelly and 30 acres of unprofitable Lands in Tenekelly, 49 Acres 3 roods and 24 Perches of Profitable Lands in Longford and 264 Acres of unprofitable Lands in Longford. Also reciting that the said John Short's Interest in said Lands of Gurteen Longford and Tenekelly were advertised to be sold by Publick Auction and were Accordingly Sett up and Actually Sold by the said Frances Short to the said John Smyth for £1,900.

1771 Deed 282 563 186709 [Part A](#) and [Part B](#): 18/05/1771 **Jonathan Short of Nenagh** to Hyacinth Daly of Galway - lands of Gorteenayanka.

1772 Deed 371 483 250759: 14th/09/1772 **Jonathan Short** (of Nenagh?) and James Power re claims in Court of Chancery to lands of Killadangan and Lisduff in Tipperary and Gorteenayanka and others in Galway.

1774 Deed 94 420 201585 Part A and Part B: 20/8/1774 Michael and Sarah Ryan of Ballinamoe in Owney and Arra to **Jonathan Shortt** of Nenagh, merchant, 14 acres in Ballinamoe.

1776 Deed 309 602 207741: 2/4/1776 **James and Jane Shortt** (otherwise Smithes) of Kilmastulla and Susanna Smithes wife to Thomas Smithes of Carrigin. Ref to deed dated 01/03/1756 in which Thomas Smithes assigned to James and Jane Short interest in Currabehy, Fintane and Grange in Eliogarty. James and Jane Short assigned to Susanna Smithes interests in Curraghbehy, Fintane and Grange in Eliogarty.

1780 Deed 331 618 223776: 14/05/1780 **John Short of Kilmastulla** to Jonathan Short of the town of Tipperary, merchant, rent for lands in Kilmastulla.

1781 Will Betham's Abstracts I/64 p.150 no. 371 William Shortt of Cashlirone, King's Co. Gent. 26/2/1768 - 26/2/1781 Sons James. William. Daus Anne, Mary. Dau. Eliz Cox. Grandchildren John and Mary Cox. Dau. Grace Otway - son John - Mary(?) dau of same(?). Sister Eliz Drew. Granddaus. Mary Grace and Elizabeth Gilbert.

1781 Deed 344 187 230881 Part A and Part B: 17/4/1781 **John Short of Pallas** (1st), **Frances Short** daughter of said John (2nd), Percy Hunt (3rd), **Wm Short of Ballinamona** and **James Short Jnr of Pallas** (4th) re marriage of Frances Short to John Piercy Hunt - lands in Ballysinode. John Piercy Hunt of Ballysinode demise lands of Ballysinode to James Short and Wm Short. Witnesses inc Vere Hunt of Cappagh, Co Tipp.

1782 Deed 345 599 235348: 7/9/1782 **John Shortt of Pallas** (1st), **William Shortt Jnr**, eldest son of said John (2nd), Benjamin Bradshaw of Alleen (3rd), Elizabeth Bradshaw second daughter (4th) and **William Shortt Snr of Ballynamona** (5th) - marriage of William Jnr to Eliz Bradshaw re lands of Ballyvanran, Upper Ormond (possession of William Short).

1782 Deed 688 270 473020 Part A and Part B: December 1782 deed of marriage settlement between John White of Lisowen, Co Limerick, Catherine White otherwise Hunte his wife (1st part), Newport White his son and Harriott White otherwise Davis his wife (2nd part), Vere Hunt of Cappa and **John Short of Pallas** (3rd part), Newport White of Kilmoylan, Co Limerick and Benjamin White of Duinpoole in Co Clare (4th part) refer to agreement dated 25/03/1778 previous to marriage of Newport White with Harriott White otherwise Davis. Mention of Revd Richd Chadwick of Chadville, Co Tipp. Deed registered 21/02/1815.

1783 Deed 351 523 237756 Part A, Part B and Part C: 14/7/1783 Marriage settlement between Thomas Wilkinson, City of Dublin, plumber (1st), **John Shortt Esq of Pallas** (2nd), **Elizabeth Shortt**, youngest daughter of said John Shortt (3rd) and Thomas Maher, City of Dublin, apothecary, Peter Wilkinson, City of Dublin, merchant, **William Shortt Snr** of Ballanamona, **Wm Short Jnr** of ???(Pallas?) (4th) re marriage shortly between Thomas Wilkinson and Elizabeth Shortt. Mention of Timothy Bagnall of Rahue, Westmeath as witness.

1785 Deed 373 353 248679 Part A and Part B: 26/8/1785 **John Shortt the elder of Pallice** to **John Shortt the younger** - Glanagill (120 acres), Upper Pallice (94 acres), Lower Pallice (103 acres), Bananagh (81 acres), all in Upper Ormond. Witness: **James Short of Newtown**, Queen's Co. and Cooper Crawford, shopkeeper.

1799 Deed 531 100 352146: 31/7/1799 Thomas and John Talbot and **John Shortt of Pallas**. Mentions **John Shortt and Grace Shortt**, two of the children of said John Shortt the Lessee and **John Shortt** the son of **James Shortt** the brother of said John Shortt the Lessee. (*I have not been able to find the microfilm for this deed so it may be that some of its details are incorrect.*)

1800 Deed 525 461 345145 Part A and Part B: 28/4/1800 Thomas Talbot and John Talbot of Cloughjordan, gents, (one part) and Robert Johnston of Emmill Castle (other part). George Percy late of Ballintemple on 28/5/1746 did demise and sell unto Richard Talbot of Garrane the lands of Garrane, 114 acres, now legally vested in said Thomas Talbot and John Talbot and 3i/8/1799 they did demise and set unto **John Shortt of Pallas** 88 acres and bog etc. late in the possession of Edward Talbot deceased. Robert Johnston hath agreed to advance to Thomas and John £300 stg and Thomas and John hath agreed to rent charge of £18 stg yearly. Yearly rent charge of £18 demised unto **John Shortt**. Endorsement: Received from **John Shortt** the within sum of £300 having agreed to give up the rent charge on Garrane for above conson. and to fulfill the promise of my late uncle. May 12th 1803 Thomas Stoney (Witness Minchin Lewis). (*This endorsement added in 1803 does not appear on the deed in the Registry of Deeds. I copied it from the copy of the original deed. Is this John Shortt the nephew of John of Pallas resident in Newtown, Mountrath by this time?*)

1802 Deed 548 335 365466: 21/1/1802 Vere Dawson Hunt of Cappagh, Tipp (1st) and **James Short of Newtown**, Queen's Co. and **Frances Hunt also Short** his dau (2nd), Henry Palmer and **William Short of Ballymackey** (3rd) and Rev John Hunt and **John Short of Pallas** (4th) - lands in Cappagh. Witnesses inc **Henry Short of Ballymona**, Tipp.

1802 Deed 544 184 362813: 6/6/1802 **William Short of Ballinamona** and **Grace Short** (dau of dau of said William) re marriage to Thos Cranford (Crauford/Crawford?) of Cranagh otherwise Ballylaghy in Ikerrin. Witnesses: **John Short and Henry Short both of Ballynamona**.

1805 Deed 571 122 383971 Part A, Part B and Part C: 13/04/1805 **John Short of Lesheen**, Tipp - marriage to Jane Fowles, daughter and only child of ??? and Susanna Fowles of Limerick - lands in Lesheen, Summerhill, Liskeard and Kilkeary.

1811 Deed 636 265 437307 Part A and Part B: 21/6/1811 **James Short of Newtown**, Queen's Co. and **Eliza Short** (otherwise Hunt) daughter of late Vere Hunt decd, his wife on one part and Vere Dawson Hunt of Cappagh, Tipp on other part. Refers to marriage between Vere Hunt late of Cappagh decd and Eliza Dawson, niece of Moses Dawson of Greenfield Co Tipp. decd. Refers to deed dated 18th/19th November 1773 between Henry Hunt, father of Vere Hunt (1st Part), Moses Dawson and Eliza Dawson, his niece (2nd part) and **John (Jonathan?) Short and William Short** (3rd part) and ??? White and ??? White (4th part) re lands in Drommad, Farleedig and Gurtnechane in Co Tipp to William and John (Jonathan?) and heirs and use to Vere Hunt for his life. Witnesses inc **James Short Jnr of Newtown**.

1811 Deed 695 395 477300 Part A and Part B: 21/6/1811 Marriage settlement made between **James Short of Newtown**, **Elizabeth Short** otherwise Hunt his wife (one part) and Vere Dawson Hunt of Cappa, **William Short of Clermont** and Revd John Hunt of High Park (other part). Mention of Fitzmaurice Hunt. Witnesses inc **James Short Jnr of Newtown** and Revd John Short (should read Hunt, I think).
